We want to make Sainsbury's store at Colton even better

We would like to extend the store to create more room for your favourite products, and expand the range of goods on offer.

Our proposals also include a new mezzanine level restaurant and improvements to the car park layout.

But before we submit a planning application, we'd like to hear what you think. This leaflet outlines the plans and gives you the opportunity to have your say.



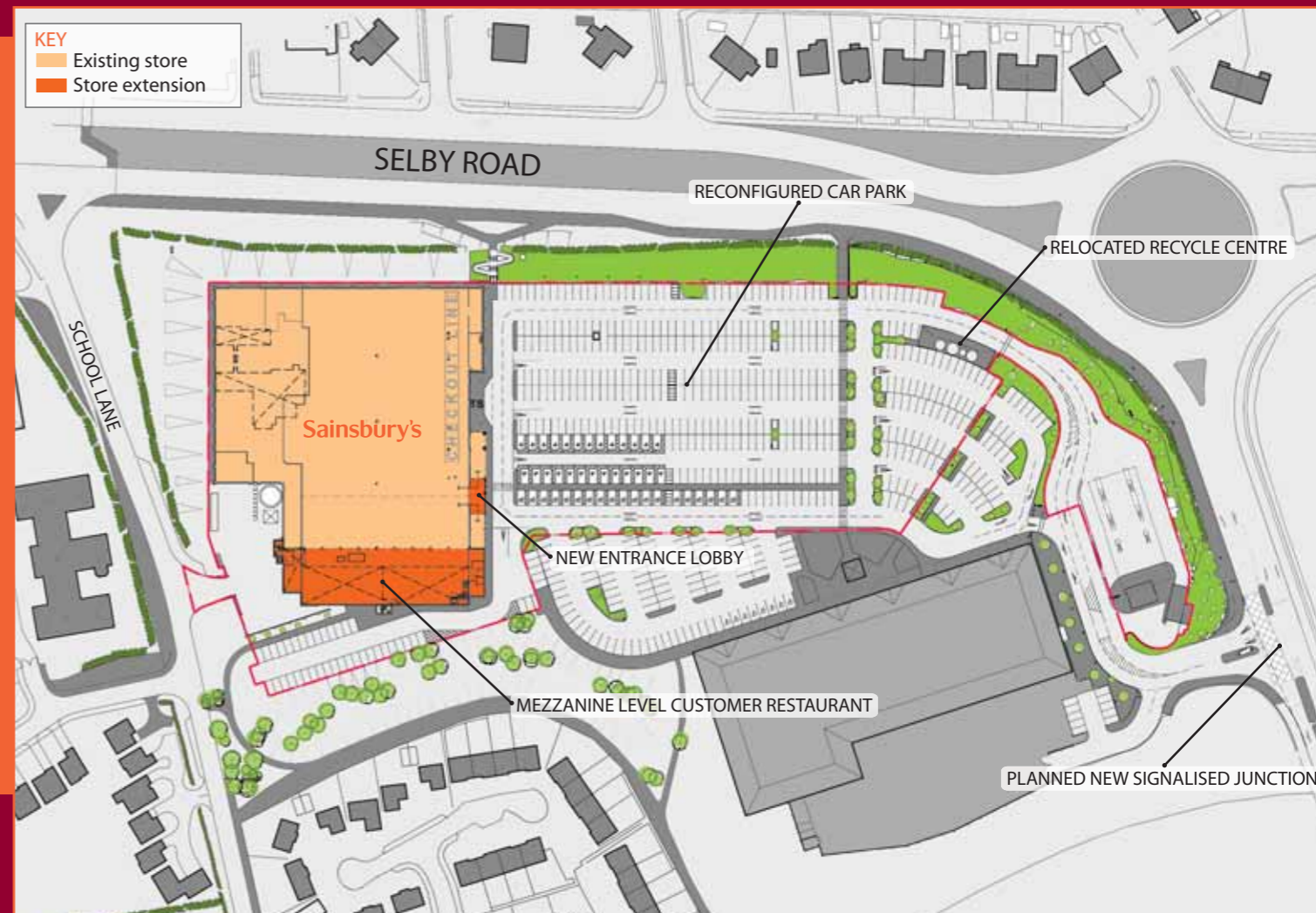
The Proposals

The plans will see an extension to the side of the store and the addition of a mezzanine level. This would allow us to provide:

- 14,000 sq ft of extra sales space
- Up to 60 new jobs for local people
- A new customer restaurant, on a mezzanine level
- Room to keep more food and non-food items in stock
- A modern, glazed lobby area
- An improved car park layout
- More disabled and parent and child car parking spaces

The plans would also relocate the recycling centre away from residential properties to the other side of the car park, making it more convenient to recycle on your way into the store.

The mezzanine level customer restaurant would be fully accessible by stairs and a lift.





A sustainable store

Sainsbury's wants to minimise the impact on the environment during construction through intelligent design, sustainable sourcing of materials, efficient use of energy and resources and site waste reduction programmes.

Using modular construction techniques, parts of the extension would be built off site, minimising disruption for our customers and the impact on the environment.

The extension would also include features to improve sustainability such as rainwater harvesting and new generation refrigeration units with significantly improved efficiency.

The plan would also use a solar tube daylighting system, which allows more natural light into the store, making it brighter and less reliant on electric lighting.

New jobs for local people

The extension would create up to 60 new jobs. As 90% of our store colleagues across the country work within a mile of where they work, this will be a big boost for the local area.



What happens next?

Sainsbury's will look to submit a planning application to Leeds City Council in the autumn. If planning permission is granted, work could begin next year and be completed by 2012.

The store would remain open throughout construction.
